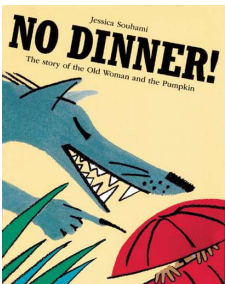

What are we learning next?

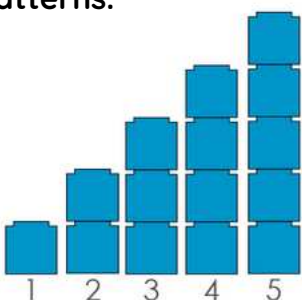


Literacy- No Dinner

We will be listening to this version of the story of the old woman and the pumpkin, a traditional tale told across the Indian subcontinent. This text will be the inspiration for lots of learning, including finding out about animals, India, food, music and different cultures alongside supporting the development of writing, vocabulary and reading comprehension.

Maths learning

We will be learning the position of numbers to 10, their relationship to other numbers and continue to develop understanding of the counting sequence. In our mastering number sessions children will continue to practise their perceptual subitising skills, explore the structure of the numbers 6 and 7 as '5 and a bit' and connect this to finger patterns.



Phonics



The children have now got reading wallets, these will contain home reading books, sheets, games or sound cards to practise at home. Please let us know how your child is getting on by writing a short comment in their reading record. This book is not a communication book so please only write information regarding reading and Phonics in these books. We would also love to hear what books you are reading together for pleasure, as this really supports early reading development. Please keep these wallets in their bags and send into school everyday.
